
Close Public Hearing

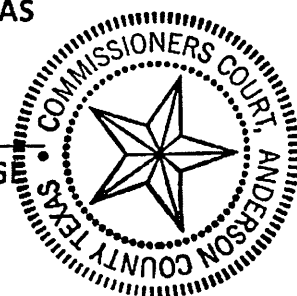
